Who wants to carry tons of CDs? Who doesn't own an MP3 player or some other portable music device? One of the most annoying things is scan or try and find a local radio station while you are traveling through a particular city. Only to have to try and find another station within the next 2 or 3 hours. Since I do not subscribe to satellite radio, I find this annoying!

An [FM Transmitter](#) is the way to go. I bought one from [Amazon](#) for \$14.99. You plug the FM Transmitter into your portable music device's speaker/headphones connection, then you set the transmitter onto one of the following 88.1, 88.3, 88.5 or 88.7 (whichever station has NO music or very little signal). Finally, you tune your car stereo or receiver to the same channel and "like magic" your MP3 player is now playing through your car speakers. The transmitter may also have a tuner wheel on it to help tune in the music for a clearer sound. Now you can enjoy your favorite music in your car anywhere you [go!](#)
